

Water Conservation Tips:

Laundry: Nearly 22% of indoor home water use comes from doing laundry. Save water by making sure to adjust the settings on your machine to the proper load size.

Dishwashing: Energy Star dishwashers use about 4 gallons of water per load, and even standard machines use only about 6 gallons. Hand washing uses about 20 gallons of water each time.

Car washing: Washing a car uses about 150 gallons of water, so by washing less frequently you can cut back your water use.

Lawn Irrigation: Nearly 60% of a person’s household water footprint can go toward lawn and garden maintenance. Watering the lawn in the hot part of the day can waste up to half the water to evaporation. Best time to water is in the early morning.
