

Council Report

At its meeting on Oct 11 the council heard from a citizen about traffic on Empire Ave. The council heard presentations from SCRAPS and the library district. Public hearings were conducted on the capital facilities plan, the property tax levy for 2017, and the preliminary 2017 budget. The council approved a grant agreement with the Utilities and Transportation Commission for construction of railroad crossing equipment on the Union Pacific track at Marguerite Rd. The council held an executive session to discuss matters of real estate.

Leaf Collection

Leaf pickup season started **October 17th** and will run through **November 21st**.

Please be patient if we haven't picked up your leaves on the same day as you have raked.

We have had an extremely wet year (a record breaking 6.2 inches of rainfall in October) and it has slowed down our progress and the ability to dump our leaves in the muddy fields.

Please remember the following guidelines when raking your leaves:

Leaves must be raked to the edge of the asphalt.

Rake leaves in straight rows no wider than 3 feet. Do not blow leaves into the street!

LEAVES ONLY with no other debris (rocks, limbs, bags, dog feces, etc.)

To make our job easier please do not rake leaves between cars, around mailboxes or within 25 feet of an intersection.

In spite of all advanced preparation, the adherence to these dates depends on weather and equipment functioning properly. Equipment breakdowns, heavy rains can slow progress, and snowstorms late in the cycle can curtail the program. We advise residents to not delay in leaf raking, as an early winter would mean the equipment and crew must be allocated to snow removal.

Thanks for your cooperation in continuing to make this a successful program.

Need to report a CRIME?

Tips for Calling

- * Know where you are and your telephone number.
- * Stay calm.
- * Answer the Call Receivers questions and stay on the line until the Call Receiver is finished obtaining the necessary information.
- * If you are unsure you have an emergency, dial 911 and let the communications center decide what action is necessary.

Do not call 911 for information. Refer to your telephone book or call your phone provider for directory assistance.

When to call 911?

- * If you are the victim of a crime that is in progress or just occurred.
 - * If you are witnessing a crime that is in progress or just occurred.
 - * If you are the victim of a crime and the suspect is still in the area.
 - * If you have a need to immediate police response to a crime.
 - * If you need to report a fire.
 - * If there is a medical emergency.
- If you need the Fire Department for a rescue or if you are trapped.

Need to report a CRIME?

When to call Crime Check?

- * To file a police report over the phone for a crime that is no longer occurring.
 - * If you witnessed a crime that previously occurred.
 - * If you have information about a past crime.
 - * To add information on a previous crime report.
 - * If you are the victim of a crime that is not in progress.
- To report a crime after the fact which does not require an officer/deputy at the scene.
