

Fire Safety-

Children have a natural curiosity about fire. Make sure your children know what to do to prevent fires and what to do in an emergency. Practice home fire drills; talk to them about fire safety and fire hazards. Have your chimney and furnace serviced and cleaned. This is also a great time to replace flashlight, smoke detector, and carbon monoxide monitor batteries.

If you have a fire hydrant near your home, make sure it is visible. Trim grass, shrubs, and weeds three feet away from the hydrant. Also with heavy snow, shovel snow three feet away from the hydrant. The house saved may be your own!
