RESOLUTION #2013 – 12

A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION #2013-09, ADOPTED NOVEMBER 5, 2013, AND ESTABLISHING THE AD VALOREM TAX FOR 2014

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Millwood, Washington (the "Council") properly gave notice and conducted a Public Hearing on October 8, 2013, to consider the City of Millwood's (the "City") Current Expense Budget and Property Tax Levy for the 2014 calendar year, and

WHEREAS, at the time of such hearing on October 8, 2013, the Spokane County Assessor's Office had advised that the City's Property Tax Levy for the 2014 calendar year would be approximately \$354,032.82, and subsequent to such hearing, the Spokane County Assessor's Officer advised that the City's Property Tax Levy for the 2014 calendar year would be approximately \$354,723.29, which is \$4,028.89 more than the City's Property Tax Levy for the 2013 calendar year, and


WHEREAS, based on such information, the Council adopted Resolution #2013-09 on November 5, 2013, which established the City's Property Tax Levy for the 2014 calendar year in the amount of \$355,000, and

WHEREAS, on November 11, 2013, the Spokane County Assessor's Office advised the City that the maximum amount of the City's Property Tax Levy for the 2014 calendar year is approximately \$357,263.35;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Millwood, Washington, that after hearing and after duly considering all relevant evidence and testimony presented, the Council determines that the City requires the City's Property Tax Levy for the 2014 calendar year in the amount of \$358,000.00 and \$616.95 in refunds made in order to discharge the expected expenses and obligations of the City and in its best interest;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it further resolve that all resolutions, laws, and regulations, or parts thereof in conflict with this resolution are, to the extent of said conflict, hereby repealed.
